## PLEASE NOTE

- This schedule can be changed during the course, but you should expect the day to start at around 8 AM and end at about 5 PM. In the evening, you have a few hours to prepare for the next day.
- The first three days represent a stand-alone Assistant Instructor course, the final four days a stand-alone Open Water Scuba Instructor program. On day four, we have not scheduled any lessons, so it's a resting day if you want. You can also use the time to catch up with your studying or practise your diving skills.
- Check the schedule for the next days lessons, so you can prepare yourself by reviewing the appropriate sections in the PADI Instructor Candidate Workbook and PADI Instructor Manual.
- During the course, you will do presentations in the classroom, in confined water and in open water. Most parts of these presentations could be done before the course (as soon as you get your assignments), but you should expect to spend some time every evening for this preparation.
- During the Assistant Instructor course, you do a Standards Exam. Passing score is 75%. As you are not expected to memorize everything in the PADI Instructor Manual, this is an open book exam.

- On the last day, you will do two exams and they will look much the same as on the IE.

**Dive Theory Examinations:** Written examinations will be administered in Physics, Physiology, Recreational Dive Planners, Dive Skills and Environment, and Equipment. Each exam consists of 12 multiple-choice questions. You must pass each exam with a score of 75% or higher. You will have a maximum of one hour and 30 minutes to complete all 60 questions on the five examinations.

**PADI Systems, Standards and Procedures Examination:** This is an open-book exam. You may use the PADI Instructor Manual (paper or digital version) and the PADI Instructor Candidate Workbook as reference. The exam consists of 50 true/false and multiple-choice questions. You will have a maximum of one hour and 30 minutes to complete this exam. Passing score is 75% or higher.
