What Information Should I Provide Before I Arrive!

- International travel itinerary/flight details 30 Days Prior.

What Visas and Travel Documents Are Required?

Please ensure your passport is valid for at least six months and that you have an onward or return ticket. U.S. and European nationals typically receive a 30-day tourist visa on arrival.

Do I Need Insurance?

Medical and dive accident insurance is highly recommended and mandatory for all liveaboard charters We highly recommend each guest purchase trip cancellation and interruption insurance. Cancellations, losses and disruptions caused by reasons outside of Atlantis' responsibility will be shouldered by the guest unless they are insured.

Spares in particular might be a problem to obtain in the Philippines, especially when there are so many different models and brands of equipment. So, if there is a remote chance that something might break or be lost, it is worth carrying a replacement. Console and secondary regulator holders are essentials: you don't want sensitive equipment dragging across the even more sensitive coral. If you do forget something or do not have a full set of your own dive gear, remember that we stock a comprehensive range of excellent for hire equipment.
